JANE BROWN comes from Leigh: 3/3/1774: "Summons on the complaint of JANE BROWN against the Overseers of Leigh for relief, returnable 10th instant at Mells." 10/3/1774: "Dismissed the complaint of Jane Brown".

13 Mar 1785 BENJAMIN FUSSEL

MARY CRAY: 21.2.1777: "Summons on the complaint of Henry Shore and James Fussell, against Benjamin Cray and Mary Cray, for hedge breaking at Whatley". 28.2.1777: " Benjamin Cray and Mary Cray,convicted of breaking the hedges of Henry Shore and Samuel Fussell in Whatley, and stealing the wood. Fined 2s 6d. each, and ordered to pay in six days or be whipped."

JOHN CURTIS: Very speculative. 23.2.1775: "Mary Foord of Mells singlewoman charged John Curtis of Shepton Malet carpenter with being the reputed father of the male bastard child of which she was lately delivered in the said parish of Mells. Warrant on the application of the Overseer of Mells, against said Curtis". 22.5.1775: "Said Curtis was apprehended by my warrant, and brought before me, and gave security to the Overseere of Mells to appear at the next special sessions 1st March, and to abide such order as the justices shall then make"

ELIZABETH /BETTY CHIVERS comes from Kilmersdon: 2.12.1773: "Allowed the following relief to the poor of Kilmersron viz. to Joseph Hambledon and Joseph Plummer 2s. each for the present. To Sarah Coombs 9d. per week, to Mary Hamblin 2s 10 1/2d. per week. Charles Plummer 9d. and a lodging or 1s. without lodging. Francis Tapp 2s. 6d. per week. Elija Clark's family 3s. per week. Better Chivers 1s. per week. Ann Aishman 6d. per week. Sarah Watts 1s. per week. Savary Moor 1s. per week. John Plummer 7s. present relief. Philippa Ashman a sheet, and Lucy Martin 9d. per week for her child in case the Overseer finds it ill". (Thos. Horner J.P. Notebooks.)

ELIZABETH DURAN comes from Elm?: She may be of the same family as the following: 28.1.1773: "Summons on the complaint of John Durin against the Overseers of Elm, for relief, returnable as above". 11.2.1773: "Allowed John Durin a poor person of Elm 1s. 6d. present relief, and referred him to the vestry."

26	Oct	1792	JANE BIGGS	JANE BIGGS: 21.1.1773: "Hester Biggs and Jane Biggs not having paid the money mentioned in my order for stealing William Baynton's turnips signed an order for the Constable to whip them." In the earlier citation of 31.12.1772 it is Hester and James Biggs, and not Jane who is convicted of stealing the turnips at Elm on 18.12.1772. They had been ordered to pay 15d. each to Baynton and 2s. 6d. each to the Overseer of the poor"on or before 6.1.1774.
13	Jan	1792	JOHN BROWN	JOHN BROWN Very speculative. 16.1.1772: "Summons on the complaint of George Ayres against John Brown, Joseph Isher, William Dredge, James Cox, and John Lewis and Mary his wife for an assault and batter at Frome, returnable as above." 23.1.1772: "Dismissed the complaint of George Ayres against John brown and others for an assault
29	Jan	1792	ANN FUSSEL	ANN FUSSEL comes from Elm: 7.4.1775: "Summons on complaint of John Biggs and Ann Fussell, poor persons of Elm, for relief". (Thos. Horner's J.P. Notebooks.)
9	Apr	1793	JOHN FUSSEL	JOHN FUSSEL: Is this the same Fussel?? It is not likely as this Fussell appears industrially successful. "21.2.1774: Granted a warrant on the information of John Fussell of Nunney edgetoolmaker against Cornelius Russell labourer, on suspicious of his having stolen four hatchets the goods of said John Fussell and partners, in Nunney aforesaid. 22.2. 1774: "Said Russell was brought before me, and it being proved that he had sold several hatchets pf 2s. a piece value for 8d. each, and that these hatchets had been stolen from Mr Fussell, I committed said Russell (he appearing a most daring rogue) to Ivelchester Gaol, and bound over Mr Fussell and his witnesses to prosecute him at the next quarter session."
